

Four immediate actions to reduce recidivism

Abolitionist group criticises Justice Reform Initiative report

1 December 2023: The National Network of Incarcerated and Formerly Incarcerated Women and Girls (National Network) has criticised a new report by the Justice Reform Initiative (JRI), 'Jailing is failing: The Need for Alternatives to Incarceration in South Australia'. The JRI report found that incarceration had increased by 32% in South Australia despite a raft of measures aimed at reducing recidivism. JRI considered prisons of any kind to be harmful and ineffective at addressing the causes of crime and reducing recidivism. Nevertheless, the abolitionist National Network criticised the JRI report as being largely written by academics with no lived experience in South Australian prisons. They called for prison abolition and full decarceration rather than reforms to the prison system. The National Network also criticized JRI's slogan, "Jailing is failing." They argued that jailing was working exactly as intended – "to contain and control certain populations."
